














Kia ora koutou o Kaipaki Kura


In the meantime, please know we are thinking of you and missing you all lots. Please don't hesitate to contact us via email if there's any way we can support you and your whanau.

At this stage, we are still 'all systems go ' for our annual Ag Day on Wednesday 20th October.
















School Production Update

Who helps me to get the money so I can get all my new clothes and helps me with my calf at ag day time.


You can hear him saying "Go the All Blacks", also he likes to say "come unpack the dishwasher" when I really don't feel like it. Finally he likes to say "He loves me".
