5 C'S LEARNING: 'CRITICAL THINKING'

In 2019 through our school production 'The Faraway Tree', we introduced the 5Cs of Learning to Kaipaki School.

The 5Cs are: Collaboration, Communication, Community, Creativity and Critical Thinking.

Each C has 3 actions: Collaboration; Contribute, Negotiate, Engage Community: Care, Appreciate, Contribute Communication: Listen, Speak, Present Creativity: Imagine, Invent, Experiment Critical Thinking: Question, Evaluate, Reflect



Throughout the last few years we have been learning about and implementing these tools for learning into all aspects of school life. Each term we have a school wide focus on one of the 5Cs. We learn about this C in many ways. We discuss and unpack the 'actions' of the C (3 words shown below on pictures). We also base and present our fortnightly class certificates around the C, and a strong

aspect of our classroom learning is focused on the C also.



Overarching Theme: Change

Alongside our 5C's learning this year, the overarching theme of our Inquiry Learning is

Change.

Under this umbrella theme, we hope to learn

more about the history of our school community, and explore the concept of change in our lives.

Change is the constant across the curriculum, so lots of opportunity for literacy, mathematics, science, technology, arts, and social science application.
