What a whirlwind Term 4! There are just so many things to celebrate in this newsletter and much to look forward to in the last couple of weeks of school for the year.



REPORTS AND CLASSES FOR 2023


Our teachers have been hard at work writing reports which highlight the great progress of our Kaipaki learners. These reports will make their way home in a sealed envelope on Friday 9th December.




The final day of school for the year is Thursday 15th December. Please note that school will finish at 2pm on this day.
