
ATTENDANCE


Term 2 saw a drop in the percentage of learners attending school regularly (defined as attending 90% or more of the time) — down to 57%, compared with 75% in Term 1.

We acknowledge that this decline reflects a number of factors, including the onset of winter illnesses and the impact of the deeply sad loss experienced within our school community during Term 2. Our thoughts, care and respect remain with all.

The Ministry of Education has noted that 20% of absences were due to holidays taken during term time. While we understand that whānau commitments and opportunities sometimes fall outside school breaks, we ask that learners attend school each day they are well enough.

Together, we can support our tamariki to get the most out of every learning opportunity.




For Ngā Hoa Pai o te Kura Kaipaki, Term three has started with a bang!
