



Aotearoa was stuck to another continent and eventually separated to become an island






There was big volcanoes and dinosaurs.



Celebrating Te Kaahui Ako o Te Oko Horoi


Thursday 18th September 2025 Lake Te Koo Utu (Albert Street entrance) 7.00am

On Thursday 18th September 2025 Ngaati Korokii Kahukura and Ngaati Hauaa will lead our annual **Te Oko Horoi celebration** at lake Te Koo Utu. This is a place of cultural significance, one which carries a legacy dating back to the time of Kingii Taawhiao, the second Maaori King.

You are warmly invited to join with our Mana Whenua in Pai Maarire, Karakia, Waiata and the story of Te Oko Horoi and Te Koo Utu.

Aakonga, kaiako, kura leaders, whaanau and community are invited to attend the ceremony. 


